The main legislative body of The United Methodist Church is called the General Conference. It meets every four years in different venues, this time in Portland, Oregon in May 2016. It is a gathering of United Methodists from the United States, Africa, Philippines (Asia-Pacific) and Europe. Partner churches from other churches with a history of Wesleyan Methodism are also invited and take part in this celebration of Church and Faith.

Our own Northern Illinois Conference is represented by lay and clergy delegates elected every four years for this purpose. The decisions affect how we do ministry for and with all the people on a global scale.

The publishing arm of the church is “Cokesbury” (from the Bishop Thomas Coke who was sent to the United States from England by John Wesley, and Francis Asbury, the first Bishop in the United States).

Cokesbury publishes two important books after the gathering. One is called the “Book of Discipline” which outlines the administration of the church. The other is the “Book of Resolutions” which is the official statement of the church as it relates with ministry in the world.

There are many legislative issues before the General Conference. For more information please go to the website (umc.org) and find relevant information about ministry and the life of the church. The theme for this quadrennial gathering is from Matthew 28:19. “Therefore go and make disciples of all.”

Here are snapshots of resolutions from this ten day assembly (May 10-20): Church vitality and Evangelism; Structure and organization of the church; New hymnal and other worship resources; Young people’s initiative; Human sexuality and full inclusion of Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual, Transsexual and Questioning (LGBTQ) into the life of the church; Social Principles.

Let us join in prayer for a spirit of hospitality and grace for all who will gather and serve in this particular way.

Meanwhile, Easter season is upon us and God revealed His power in bringing Jesus back to life. “Go and make Disciples.” With many thanks for your partnership and commitment to *Our Redeemer’s* United Methodist Church.

Dear Church Family,

The Crisis Center is always in need of so many different things. At the present time they are in need of the following items for the month of April: Powdered laundry detergent (H E formula), fabric softener sheets, dishwashing liquid, dishwasher powder/liquid, bleach, cleansers, SOS pads, dishcloths, towels, sponges, aluminum foil, plastic wrap, plastic storage bags, plastic drinking cups and cereal bowls, flatware, kitchen utensils, large storage containers with lids, ground coffee (regular and decaf), bath towels, washcloths (new or gently used), box and oscillating fans.

In addition the Crisis Center is always in need of the following food items: Non-perishable canned and boxed goods: canned items with pop top lids, canned fruit, soups, Ravioli, Spaghettio's, sloppy joe mix, applesauce, cereal, pasta and sauces, saltine and graham crackers, microwave popcorn, granola bars, fruit and pudding cups, juice boxes, Instant tea, soft drink mixes.

Baby needs: disposable diapers (larger sizes and pull ups), diaper wipes.

Toiletries: toothpaste and tooth brushes, bar soap, shampoo and conditioner.

Please place your items in the CCC bin located in the closet, left of the desk in the Narthex.

On behalf of my family, I would like to thank my ORUMC family for all of the loving care you showed us both before and after the passing of my mother, Winnie Smith.

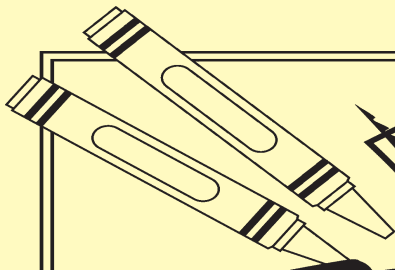
Your cards, hugs and prayers were so thoughtful and welcome. She lived a long and full life for her 100 years and it's comforting to know she is at peace now.
