Advent 2017 is upon us and it begins with our Advent Festival on Saturday, *December 2nd.* Join us in preparing the church for the Sundays in Advent. We will be trying something new this year. Every Sunday, our confirmation families will be õbuildingö the creche by adding the different manger characters: Joseph, Angels, Shepherds, Mary and the Three Kings. *Jesus* remains the focus in the manger, the *Word* became flesh.

St. Francis of Assisi, began the Christmas tradition of nativity scenes in 1223 because he wanted the people to gain a fresh sense of wonder. Up to that time, people celebrated Christmas primarily by going to Mass and hear the story in a language that most ordinary folks did not understand: Latin.

This presented Francis an opportunity to tell the story in a different way. He borrowed some animals and straw to set up a scene to represent Jesus Christøs birth in Bethlehem. It was set up in a cave. There were different characters playing respective roles. It was related that actual local shepherds were tending their flock in the nearby field. Francis told the story of the first Christmas and the importance of placing their faith in Christ. It is all about God coming down to offer salvation.

On Christmas Day the message remains the sameô the joy of Christ in our midst. Silence is often interpreted as a protest against oppression and control. In contrast, to shout for joy is to express happiness and release from the daily grind especially when faced with difficult challenges. In the Bible, *Jubilee* is sometimes used to express this hope but its meaning can be traced to this longing for hope. Jubilee is also associated with a certain


