




### See All The People

### Don't Be Dismayed By Imperfection

There is oan elephant in the room it that can to be denied by those of us who 1) read the Daily Herald and 2) profess to be followers of God.

Our local area is home to two famous megachurches. Each has done a phenomenal amount of good; each has brought a multitude of people to Christ. Over the past year, however, the Herald has had to report on very disturbing issues at each.

Meanwhile, reprehensible acts by certain Catholic priests have been revealed and reported throughout the world. Readers who do not consider themselves to be especially õreligiousö might be understandably repelled by it all.

I do believe, however, we can find some helpful insight in the Bible. If there is one biblical passage all your readers may know, perhaps it to the 23rd Psalm, written by King David 3,000 years ago.

David knew we would not be perfect (he certainly wasnøt!) He correctly implied that weøre often as mindless as sheep. King David wrote õHe leads me in paths of righteousness. Ö Yet, we so often wonder off that path, though itøs there õfor His nameøs sake. Ö

Alas, the founding pastors of those megachurches were found to be far from perfect. Evil priests were hidden by seemingly very good ones.


My own Protestant denomination will soon be struggling with (and probably bickering about) a potentially contentious matter.

I do worry that those grappling with life American Hard Questions might be turned off to God by the imperfection of all His children.

Yet no one needs Him more. He will truly provide õgoodness and mercyö throughout their life (just not necessarily pleasure and ease.)

Then, once recognized, that goodness and mercy can be treasured õall the days of our life.ö
